There were 127 entries from across the island of Ireland competing in 7 different classes of boat.

The competition zone was 3 miles off shore in Belfast Lough and participants spent approx 6 hours in their boat each day, along with briefings, rigging and derigging. Points awarded to individual sailors overall positions were allocated toward various trophies, including the coveted NI Schools Cup where CGS was awarded a very well earned 2nd place.
